Number of health care facilities supported with toilet cleaning and disinfection supplies	23	23	100%	With the COVID 19 pandemic, regular disinfection of surfaces at public institution is a requirement. To this end, 23 HCFs received toilet cleaning and disinfection supplies through this intervention.
